Hazardous Material Storage Permit

Hazardous substances shall not be left unattended within 100 feet of any building without a permit from the Fire Department. The permit may not be issued or greater separation from the building may be required depending upon the nature of the hazard. The Fire Department may order hazardous materials to be removed from any public or private property if the presence of such material does not comply with Board of Fire Prevention Regulations.

527CMR § 8

Application for permit must be made in person to the Fire Prevention office. Please submit a description of the proposed hazardous materials to be stored, a diagram of proposed storage/control areas and separation for incompatible substances, an overview of safeguards in place and/or proposed, applicable standards to which safeguards and storage areas comply, and any other documentation or proof requested by the fire inspector in regards to safeguards, procedures, policies, and/or materials being stored. If applicable, loading and unloading policies and procedures shall be submitted and reviewed by the inspector.

Diagrams/maps, HM MSDS or equivalent, and documentation required by the inspector shall be attached to the issued permit. A copy shall be secured in a central location as ID by the fire inspector. The Copy shall be immediately accessible to response units. The permit shall indicate the location of the documentation.

The permit is subject to an inspection. Conditions and restrictions are at the discretion of the inspector.
