1. Approval of Meeting Minutes: March 23, 2023
2. Old Business:
 1. Concerns raised about parking congestion on Parker St. from Orange to Brownell St. and it's impact on safety vehicles passing through the area, comment was requested from the Attleboro Fire Chief regards this issue. Councilwoman Bennett was going to follow up with AFD.
 2. Concerns raised by a resident re: the crosswalk on Oak Hill Avenue by Hyman Fine School. The issues are:
 - a. Poor visibility of the cross walk for drivers coming around the bend, therefore not slowing down in time when approaching the cross walk.
 - b. No Sidewalk on Oak Hill Avenue across from Hyman Fine for Students/parents to walk towards the school.
 - c. Inadequate school crossing signage on Oak Hill Ave. as you approach the school and cross walk.

DPW made a site visit and identified that faded signage and crosswalk paint stripes in the area. New high visibility signs have been installed since the last TSC meeting and a recommendation

was made by the TSC to have the cross walk stripes repainted at the earliest possible date.

3. SEE; CLICK; FIX: Parking congestion on Frank Mossberg Dr. Has disrupted attempts by tractor trailers to back into loading docks. Business owner is requesting some kind of signage to allow space for trucks to access the loading docks. Councilwoman Bennett, Paul Astphan, Mike Tyler and Bobby Araujo made a site visit with Mr. Chatfield from General Metals Fabricating to view first hand the parking situation on Frank Mossberg Dr. Pictures taken by Councilwoman Bennett were forwarded to the TSC members for their review. Additionally, a request for temporary no parking signs from Townsend Rd to Extension St. has been made by Mr. Chatfield and that request has been forwarded to APD by Councilwoman Bennett.

5. New Business brought forward by the Mayor: A resident on Phillips St. sent the following email to the Mayor. "I live on Phillips Street. I was outside with my son getting the mail and it seemed almost deliberate that a person saw us and went even faster".
