The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Superintendent of Water Kourtney Wunschel regarding the need for funds to install a 6” water main on Franklin Street. The Water Department has drafted a scope of work to replace the 1 ½” water main on Franklin Street with a new 6” water main and has received bids for this scope of work, as well as quotes for materials, paving, and permits needed for the project. The requested amount includes a 15% contingency. Therefore, the Mayor respectfully requests Your Honorable Body appropriate \$82,276.00 from Account 6100-359000 Water Enterprise Retained Earnings to Fund 3335- Franklin St Water Main. (Copies in your packets)

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Superintendent of Public Works Michael Tyler regarding the need for funds to purchase and install an ornamental streetlight on the corner of Pleasant Street and Emory Street. This streetlight was damaged by a “hit and run” accident and had to be removed three years ago and was never replaced due to lack of funding. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$19,860.00 from Account 11241000-578300 (City Wide – Reserve Fund for Transfer) to Account 14201000-530101 (Public Works – Professional Services).

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Superintendent of Wastewater Thomas Hayes regarding the need for funds to make the necessary repairs to the tracks on the 2002 Caterpillar D5LGP Bulldozer. A 25% contingency has been added to the requested amount. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$8,500.00 from Account 6000-578300 (Wastewater Enterprise Fund – Reserve Fund for Transfer) to Account 6000-524017 (Wastewater Enterprise Fund – Repair Heavy Equipment).

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Chief of Police Kyle P. Heagney regarding the need for funds to replace fifty - (50) computers. It has been determined that the current computers in the Police Department have served beyond their useful life expectancy and should be replaced. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$55,750.00 from Account 11241000-578380 (City Wide – Reserve Fund for Capital) to Account 12101000-585140 (Police – Computer Equipment).

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Director of Recreation Dennis Walsh regarding the need for funds to purchase a new mower. This request is to replace the 72” wingspan mower which was purchased in 2005. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$35,190.00 from Account 11241000-578380 (City Wide – Reserve Fund for Capital) to Account 16301000-585046 (Recreation – Mower).

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Director of Recreation Dennis Walsh regarding the need for funds to purchase a Ford F150 vehicle. This vehicle will replace the department’s 2003 Ford Ranger. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$29,157.05 from Account 11241000-578380 (City Wide – Reserve Fund for Capital) to Account 16301000-587065 (Recreation – Purchase of Vehicle).

The Mayor respectfully submits a communication from Director of Recreation Dennis Walsh regarding the need for funds to have necessary repairs and maintenance done to the asphalt parking lot and walking paths at the Poncin-Hewitt Recreational Facility. A 10% contingency has been added to the requested amount. Therefore, the Mayor hereby requests Your Honorable Body transfer \$33,261.00 from Account 11241000-578380 (City Wide – Reserve Fund for Capital) to Account 16301000-584029 (Recreation – Outdoor Facility Improvements).
